In 2023, the CCC was blessed with more than 150 active volunteers who gave their time and talents to assist our patients, families, and health care professionals in TMC, Conroe, Woodlands, and Kingwood. To exemplify their impact, Pastoral Visitors at Houston Methodist hospital at TMC, logged 3,918.55 hours (January 2023 – October 2023) which is the equivalent of 2 full time employees. Dear Friends in Christ,

Advent marks the special time of year that allows us to prepare for Christmas. The word "advent" comes from the Latin word adventus. Literally, adventus means "coming" or "arrival." In the days of antiquity, the adventus was more than just a word. The adventus was an event. And it wasn't just some regular, mundane event. The adventus was a special event that celebrated the arrival of the Roman emperor into a city. In order to mark the special occasion, the people would decorate the city with flowers and banners, they would be great parties and festivals, and there would be special games. There would even mint special coins, and some of these ancient coins exist today! Of course, because it was such a big event, the adventus would require much planning and preparation before the celebration began. The early Christians

adopted the notion of the *adventus* in order to mark the special time of preparation for the great arrival of Jesus Christ on Christmas. It's easy to lose focus on the true meaning of Christmas because there is so much activity during the holiday season, and Advent calls us to center our attention on Christ during this chaotic time of year. So, what can we do in order to prepare for the *adventus* of Christ?

St. Bernard of Clairvaux, the great 12<sup>th</sup> Century saint and doctor of the Church, wrote about the three comings of the Lord. The first coming has already happened: Jesus Christ was born in Bethlehem 2,000 years ago. The second coming has yet to happen: Jesus Christ will come in glory at the end of the world, and he will judge the living and the dead according to their works. Right now, we live in between the first and second coming, so when is the third coming? The third coming happens right now. At every moment of our lives, Jesus is knocking on the door of our hearts. Jesus is present to us in prayer. Jesus is present to us in the scriptures. Jesus is present to us in our neighbor. Most especially, Jesus is present to us in the sacraments. In order to prepare for the adventus of Christ, I recommend that you spend time in prayer, read the scriptures, and help your neighbor in need. In these next

several weeks, I also highly recommend that you go to confession and strive to prepare for and go to Sunday Mass. If you do these things, you will be prepared for the *adventus* of the Lord and you will enter more deeply into the true meaning of Christmas.
