SISTER TERESITA PARTIN, CV.I AND SISTER DOROTHY SACHNIK, CV.I. BEGIN THE OFFICE OF AGING MINISTRY, A DIOCESAN SERVICE FUND OFFICE. SISTER PARTIN SERVES AS THE FIRST DIRECTOR. THEIR VISION ADAPTS UP-TO-DATE RESEARCH AND PRACTICES ON AGING TO THE PASTORAL AND PERSONAL NEEDS OF OLDER ADULTS. CONSULTATIONS AND WORKSHOPS HELP PARISH LEADERS MAXIMIZE THEIR EFFORTS TO MINISTEREFFECTIVELY TO THE NEEDS OF THE AGING.

THE SENIOR SENATE STRUCTURE IS FORMED TO PROVIDE AN ADVISORY BRIDGE BETWEEN PARISH SENIOR GROUPS AND THE OFFICE. 21 ACTIVE SENIOR PARISH GROUPS ARE IDENTIFIED. THE OFFICE PROVIDES ADULT ENRICHMENT CLASSES, A SPIRITUAL DAY OF REFLECTION, AND SEVERAL SOCIAL CELEBRATIONS. RECOGNITION DAYS IS INITIATED AS AN ANNUAL EVENT TO HONOR OUTSTANDING SERVICE EFFORTS FROM PARISH SENIORS.

THE OFFICE OF AGING EXPANDS TO PROVIDE OUTREACH SERVICES. SERVICES ENTAIL A FRIENDLY VISITOR PROGRAM TO PROVIDE AGING ADULTS WITH A VARIETY OF PASTORAL AND PRACTICAL IN-HOME SERVICES. THE OUTREACH PROGRAM TRANSFERS IN THE 1980S TO CATHOLIC CHARITIES' SERVICES TO THE ALONE AND FRAIL ELDERLY.

1986

THE THIRD AGE CENTER IS ESTABLISHED USING SENIOR VOLUNTEERS TO TEACH A VARIETY OF CLASSES TO OTHER SENIORS. THE OFFICE OF AGING CONTINUES TO PROVIDE OUTREACH SERVICES TO NEW PARISH SENIOR GROUPS.

THE SENIOR SENATE STRUCTURE EXPANDS TO INCLUDE THE CENTRAL, SOUTHWEST, AND NORTHERN AREAS OF THE ARCHDIOCESE. EACH SENATE CONSISTS OF REPRESENTATIVES FROM PARISH SENIOR CLUBS WHO MEET MONTHLY OR QUARTERLY. THEY CONVENE TO PRAY, EXCHANGE CLUB ACTIVITIES, ADVOCATE FOR AGING SUPPORT RESOURCES, AND CELEBRATE SERVICE RECOGNITION, WEDDING ANNIVERSARIES, AND SPIRITUAL DAYS OF REFLECTION.

2020

THE OFFICE OF AGING HELPS SENIORS NAVIGATE THROUGH THE MONTHS OF COVID WHEN IN PERSON PARISH MEETINGS ARE VIRTUALLY NON-EXISTENT. THE OFFICE HOSTS ZOOM MEETINGS WITH COMMUNITY EDUCATORS OR DAYS OF PRAYER, MAINTAINS PHONE OUTREACH TO SENIOR CLUB LEADERS, UPDATES WEBPAGE RESOURCES, AND SENDS WEEKLY PARISH CLUB EMAIL MEMOS WITH COMMUNITY AND SPIRITUAL RESOURCES.

HEALTHY HABITS FOR THE YEAR 2024!

Anyone who is joined to Christ is a new being; the old is gone, the new has come (2 Corinthians 5:17)

It's common to start a new year with new resolutions. We often forget about them or become discouraged when we don't see immediate positive results. Consider trying a more realistic planning approach which should gradually produce results. Here are some suggestions:

- **1. Eating**: Instead of counting calories or going on a restricted diet, eat more slowly, being mindful of the taste of the food. This simple action can transform your relationship with food and help you tune in to your body's signals when your body feels satisfied.
- **2. Being active** and enjoying what you do. Whether hiking, walking, dancing, singing while cooking, or any other activity you love.
- **3. Sleeping** is crucial for physical and mental well-being. For persons 65+ years old, 7-8 hours is recommended. Avoid day naps when possible to help maximize a sound night's sleep.
- **4. Reducing stress** can be achieved through simple activities such as meditating, praying, walking, and volunteering.
- **5. Hydration:** Water is one of the best ways to stay hydrated and maintain good health. For older adults, the recommendation is to consume at least 57.5 fluid ounces. Try soups or other healthy fruit beverages.
- **Small steps can make a difference.** God's mercy is infinite, and every new day is a fresh start. Let us ask the Holy Spirit to grant us strength and wisdom in this new year of 2024.



¡HÁBITOS SALUDABLES PARA EL AÑO 2024!

Todo aquel que se une a Cristo es un ser nuevo; lo viejo se fue, lo nuevo ha llegado (2 Corintios 5:17)

Es común comenzar un nuevo año con nuevos propósitos. A menudo nos olvidamos pronto de ellos o nos desanimamos cuando no vemos resultados positivos inmediatos. Considere la posibilidad de probar un enfoque de planificación más realista que debería producir resultados gradualmente. Aquí hay algunas sugerencias:

- **1. Comer**: en lugar de contar calorías o seguir una dieta restringida, come más lentamente y presta atención al sabor de la comida. Esta simple acción puede transformar su relación con la comida y ayudarlo a sintonizar las señales de su cuerpo cuando se siente satisfecho.
- **2. Estar activo** y disfrutar de lo que haces. Ya sea hacer senderismo, caminar, bailar, cantar mientras cocinas o cualquier otra actividad que te guste.
- **3. Dormir** es crucial para el bienestar físico y mental. Para personas mayores de 65 años, se recomiendan entre 7 y 8 horas. Evite las siestas diurnas cuando sea posible para ayudar a maximizar un sueño reparador por la noche.
- 4. Reducir el estrés mediante actividades sencillas como meditar, orar, caminar y ofrecerse como voluntario.
- **5. Hidratación:** El agua es una de las mejores formas de mantenerse hidratado y mantener una buena salud. Para los adultos mayores, la recomendación es consumir al menos 57,5 onzas líquidas. La mayoría de las botellas de agua contienen 16,9 onzas (es decir, 3,5 botellas al día). Pruebe sopas u otras bebidas de frutas saludables.
- Pequeños pasos pueden marcar la diferencia. La misericordia de Dios es infinita y cada nuevo día es un nuevo comienzo. Pidamos al Espíritu Santo que nos conceda fuerza y sabiduría en este nuevo año 2024.
