# 2025 - A YEAR OF CHANGE AND SIGNIFICANCE

This year, 2025, is a year of change and significance. As a year of jubilee that only happens in the life of the church every 25 years, 2025 is a time for reenergizing the faithful, this year with a focus on being Pilgrims of Hope in the world. This is a year for us in the Archdiocese of Galveston Houston with a new Archbishop, Most Reverend Joe S. Vasquez, an event that has not happened since Cardinal DiNardo succeeded Archbishop Joseph Fiorenza in 2006. Now it is also a time for a new Pope with the recent death of Pope Francis and election of Pope Leo XIV.

Here in the Office of Aging Ministry, 2025 is also a year of change and significance. At the beginning of this year we launched the new SAINTS University, a community of faith, fellowship and fun with classes and events in four communities - the central community, northern community, the southwest community and, for the first time, the Spanish community. Previously known as senates, the three communities – central, northern and southwest have been identified as communities to emphasize the goal of each community as a place where everyone attending is seen and heard, valued and loved. All three communities are open to anyone 50+ years and the people who love them. No longer is membership limited to two representatives from each parish in the region. We are hopeful that the communities are a place to meet peers from other parishes and for those of you who may not have a senior program in your parish, we hope to provide one here in the Archdiocese.

This year we also began our newest community, our Spanish community where seniors, and the people who love them, who are Spanish-speaking can gather for faith, fellowship and fun. Each community has a calendar of activities and events. A full calendar for all four communities within SAINTS University is included in this newsletter. Please join us and bring a friend or come and make a new friend!

In addition to the four communities, SAINTS University also has other programs and events for all four communities and the community generally, such as the Day of Prayer in March and the Senior Resource Fair we held in April. In addition, there is a monthly online newsletter called the SAINTS Messenger that features upcoming events, introductions to various saints, prayers, resources and other current news items. If you have not yet received a copy of the SAINTS Messenger and you would like to, please use the QR code to join our community.

Please know that no matter the season of change, we are thinking of you, praying for you and you are at the center of all we are doing.

### **SPANISH SENIOR COMMUNITY**

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

More than 50 years after establishing our archdiocesan office, we see the positive outcomes of the National Pastoral Plan for Hispanic Latinos, an initiative from the United States Conference of Catholic Bishops (USCCB). This effort involves Their Eminences Archbishop Joe S. Vásquez, the current Archbishop of the Archdiocese of Galveston-Houston, and Bishop Italo Dell'Oro.

The vision and mission of this pastoral plan are to foster connections with marginalized, lonely, or isolated individuals, thereby creating a culture of encounter.

I am honored to share some of the events and initiatives we have developed with Hispanic communities through our Office of Aging during this first quarter.

On Saturday, February 15, we held a training session for Hispanic leaders to enhance their capacity to serve Hispanic older adults within parish communities. This event was a tremendous success, with 24 leaders from 10 parishes across the diocese in attendance. As a result of this training, we formed a Spanish-speaking leadership team consisting of six members dedicated to serving Spanish-speaking older adults. On March 24, these six leadership team members, representing the Hispanic community, attended the Day of Prayer for the first time. They received a blessing and were officially inducted as members of the Hispanic Leadership Team (names and photos are included).

On April 12, I was honored to lead a Resource Fair at St. Ignatius Loyola for the first time. We brought together more than 50 exhibitors, conducted twelve presentations, and had five food sponsors, attracting over 150 attendees. The event received excellent feedback, and we are grateful for the fantastic turnout and support from 37 volunteers. Lázaro Contreras, the Director of Hispanic Ministry, served as our master of ceremonies for the presentations.

I am also pleased to announce that we will hold our first in-person leadership meeting on May 23rd. We are confident that this will mark the beginning of significant projects to benefit Hispanic communities.

You represent the communities that serve older adults in Spanish and are pioneers and key players in various projects, events, and participation within faith communities. Therefore, I invite you to encourage your members, family, and parish communities to join us and subscribe to our emails for information about our projects planned for 2025. This invitation is open to all, both Catholics and non-Catholics.

We thank God and the Virgin Mary for the opportunity to continue working for the common good, serving, accompanying, and being a source of transformation and evangelization. Together, we aim to foster a culture of encounter where our older adults experience the presence of the risen Christ, feeling seen, valued, and loved.

### **COMUNIDAD DE ADULTOS MAYORES ESPAÑOL**

Queridos Hermanos y Hermanas en Cristo: Más de 50 años después de establecer nuestra oficina arquidiocesana, vemos los resultados positivos del Plan Pastoral Nacional para los Hispanos Latinos, una iniciativa de la Conferencia de Obispos Católicos de los Estados Unidos (USCCB). Este esfuerzo involucra a Sus Eminencias, el Arzobispo Joe S. Vásquez, actual Arzobispo de la Arquidiócesis de Galveston-Houston, y el Obispo Italo Dell'Oro. La visión y la misión de este plan pastoral son fomentar conexiones con personas marginadas, solitarias o aisladas, creando así una cultura de encuentro.

Me honra compartir algunos de los eventos e iniciativas que hemos desarrollado con las comunidades hispanas a través de nuestra Oficina de Envejecimiento durante este primer trimestre.

El sábado 15 de febrero, realizamos una sesión de capacitación para líderes hispanos con el fin de fortalecer su capacidad para servir a los adultos mayores hispanos en las comunidades parroquiales. Este evento fue todo un éxito, con la asistencia de 24 líderes de 10 parroquias de toda la diócesis. Como resultado de esta capacitación, formamos un equipo de liderazgo hispanohablante compuesto por seis miembros dedicados a servir a los adultos mayores hispanohablantes.

El 24 de marzo, estos seis miembros del equipo de liderazgo, en representación de la comunidad hispana, asistieron por primera vez al Día de Oración. Recibieron una bendición y fueron incorporados oficialmente como miembros del Equipo de Liderazgo Hispano (se incluyen nombres y fotos).





El 12 de abril, tuve el honor de dirigir por primera vez una Feria de Recursos en San Ignacio de Loyola. Reunimos a más de 50 expositores, realizamos doce presentaciones y contamos con cinco patrocinadores de alimentos, atrayendo a más de 150 asistentes. El evento recibió excelentes comentarios y agradecemos la fantástica participación y el apoyo de 37 voluntarios. Lázaro Contreras, director del Ministerio Hispano, fue nuestro maestro de ceremonias para las presentaciones.

También me complace anunciar primera celebraremos nuestra reunión presencial de liderazgo el 23 de mayo. Confiamos en que esto marcará el inicio de proyectos significativos en beneficio de las comunidades hispanas. Ustedes representan a las comunidades que atienden a los adultos mayores en español y son pioneros y actores clave en diversos proyectos, eventos y participación dentro de las comunidades de fe. Por lo tanto, los invito a animar a sus miembros, familiares comunidades У parroquiales a unirse a nosotros y suscribirse a nuestros correos electrónicos para obtener información sobre nuestros proyectos planificados para 2025. Esta invitación está abierta a todos, tanto católicos como no católicos.

Agradecemos a Dios y a la Virgen María por la oportunidad de seguir trabajando por el bien común, sirviendo, acompañando y siendo fuente de transformación y evangelización.

Juntos, buscamos fomentar una cultura de encuentro donde nuestros adultos mayores experimenten la presencia de Cristo resucitado, sintiéndose vistos, valorados y amados.


